

THE LOUISE HOWARTH MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP

Louise (Bunk) Howarth was a physical education teacher in the Department of Physical Education for approximately 20 years (1950-1968). She specialized in water sports (swimming and canoeing) and was involved in dance and gymnastics. Besides being an outstanding teacher, Ms. Howarth exhibited an unusual dedication for her students, prodding them to achieve beyond their own expectations. An outdoorswoman, a respected physical educator, Louise Howarth was honored by over 300 of her former students and colleagues at her retirement in 1968.

A monetary award will be given annually to a student who meets the following criteria:

- A) Is a Physical Education major with a minimum of 56 completed credit hours**
- B) Shows potential as an outstanding teacher**
- C) Is skillful—3.0 average in major skill courses**
- D) Utilizes skills in professional endeavors including, but not limited to, service and volunteer work**
- E) Has a minimum current grade point average of 2.8**

Application requirements

- Letter of application from student, explaining skills/abilities that merit consideration for the award
- Official university transcripts
