NOTES

- Academic Writing (AW) and Math (MA) must be attempted by 30 and completed by 60 credits.
- A grade of “C-” or higher is required in AW, MA, PW and all major requirements.
- A grade of “D-” or higher is required for General Education and General Elective courses.
- GenEd courses can double count for multiple areas.
- KNES 497 should be taken in your final semester (not offered in winter).
- Where a pre-requisite is required, a “C-” must be earned in the pre-requisite before attempting the next course.
- 12 of your last 30 credits must be KNES courses, and 15 of your last 30 credits must be upper-level (300 or 400).
- A single or double major requires a minimum of 120 credits and a double degree requires a minimum of 150 credits.
