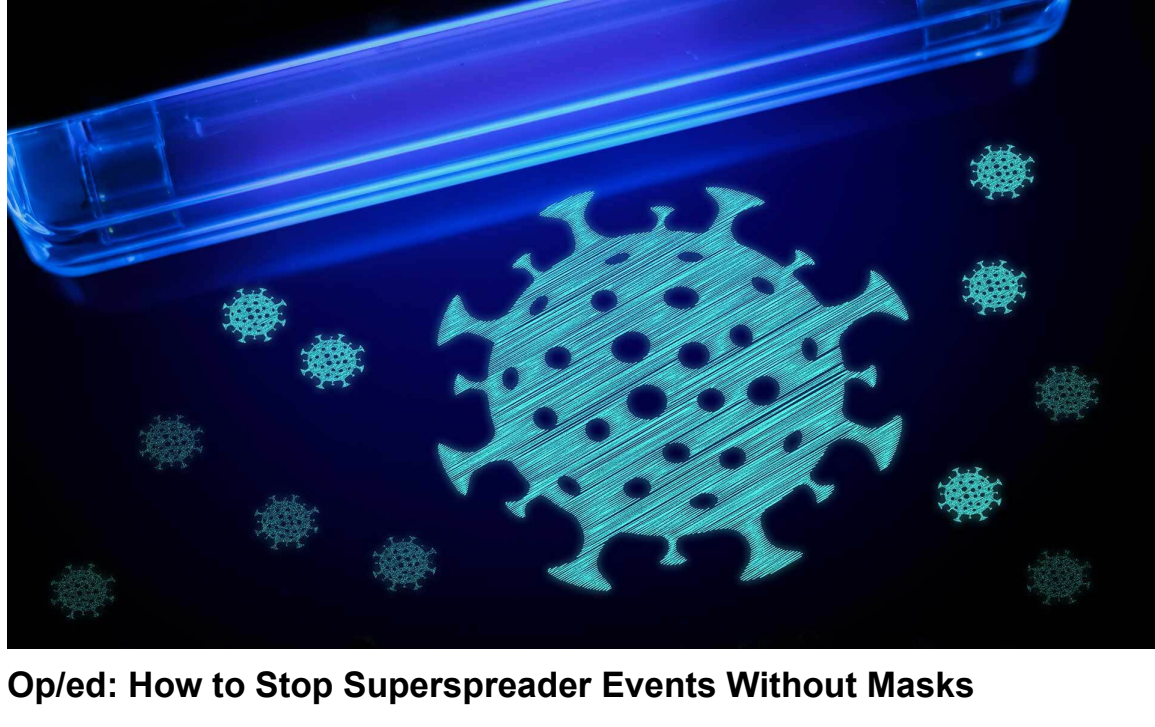

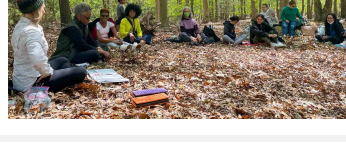
## Op/ed: How to Stop Superspreader Events Without Masks

On Wednesday, May 4, our faculty and staff honored over 180 outstanding students through a convocation ceremony.



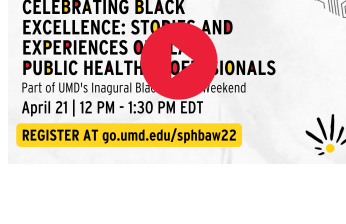
## Welcome 2022 Delta Omega Gamma Zeta Inducees

## SPH Students Selected for Summer Research Fellowships with Maryland Department of Health

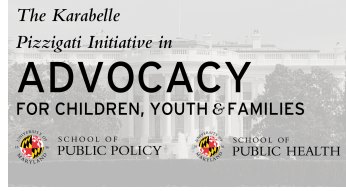

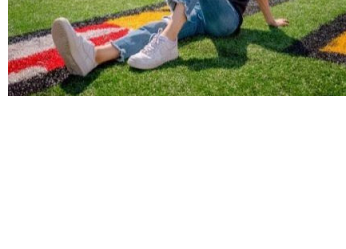

## Some Good News | Health Issue Inspires Student to Live and Promote Wellness Practices

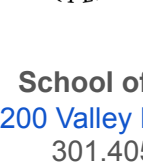
