**III.B.**      **Teaching Innovations**

**III.B.1.**      **Course or Curriculum Development**

*EPIB 637 Social Epidemiologic Methods in Health Equity Research*

I created a graduate level course to provide students with the knowledge and skills to design and implement social epidemiology studies related to investigating health inequities. The course presents an overview of drivers of health inequities (e.g., racism, socioeconomic status) and conceptual and methodological challenges in empirically investigating these social determinants of health including issues related to confounding, selection bias, measurement error, and evaluation of mechanisms. EPIB 637 covers methodological approaches that can be used to address these challenges including instrumental variable analyses, difference-in-differences, mediation analyses using

inverse odds ratio weighting, and qualitative analyses. This knowledge is applied to exploring research questions of the students' choice in their final paper and presentation. The course fosters a co-learning environment and recognizes the value and strength of interdisciplinary perspectives. Curiosity and critical thinking are encouraged and supported.
