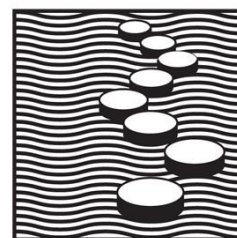


MENTORSHIP DEVELOPMENT OPPORTUNITY FOR COMMUNITY ENGAGED RESEARCHERS

Thursday, December 5: 11:30 a.m. – 2:30 p.m.

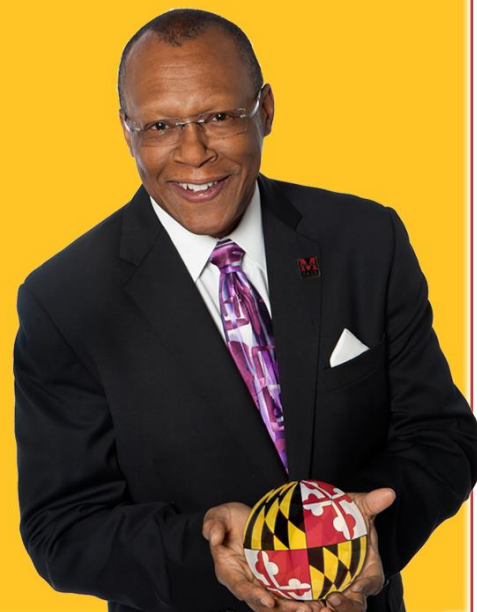
Thursday, December 19: 11:30 a.m. – 2:30 p.m.
